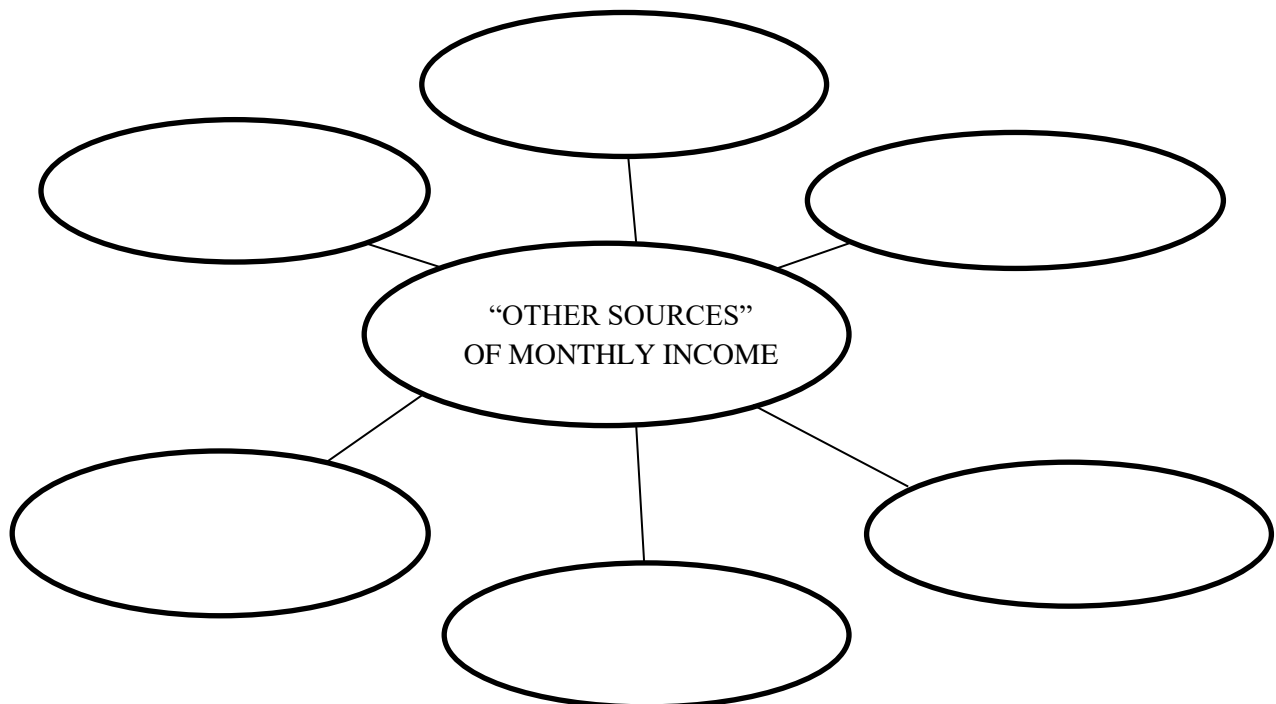
Directions: Follow the steps below to calculate your total net monthly income from all sources.

Before we calculate your total net monthly income, we must first determine the amount of income that you will receive from other sources. *Do not include your salary that you receive from your full time employer in this step.*

Examples of other sources of monthly income:

1. Goods or services provided by you (babysitting, lawn mowing, repairing computers).
1. Salary bonus (usually given by your employer to you for excellent job performance).
2. Birthday or holiday gifts (cash gifts and gift cards).
3. Internal Revenue Service tax refund (cash returned to you by state or local government).
4. Overtime pay (working more than 40 hours per week at your full time job).
5. Part-time employment (an extra job that you perform for pay, usually less than 30 hours per week).
